Executive Order Number 16-01

(Emergency Management –Hurricane Matthew- 10/03/2016)

WHEREAS, Hurricane Matthew is a major hurricane traveling north through the central part of the Caribbean Sea;

WHEREAS, the five-day forecast from the National Hurricane Center suggest that large portions of the East Coast of Florida may face significant impacts from Hurricane Matthew;

WHEREAS, Hurricane Matthew poses a severe threat to the Town of Malabar, Florida and requires timely precautions are taken to protect the community, critical infrastructure and the general welfare of this Town;

WHEREAS, as Mayor, I am responsible to meet the dangers presented to this Town and its people by this emergency; and,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, PHILLIP R. CREWS, as Mayor of the Town of Malabar, by virtue of the authority vested in me by Article II, Section 2.04 of the Town of Malabar Charter and by the Florida Emergency Management Act as amended, and all other applicable laws, promulgate the following Executive Order to take immediate effect:

Section 1. Because of the foregoing conditions, I declare that a state of emergency exists in the Town of Malabar, State of Florida due to the severity and magnitude of this storm.

Section 2. I designate Fire Chief Christopher Robinson as the Town Coordinating Officer for the duration of this emergency and direct him to insure compliance with Brevard County Comprehensive Emergency Management plan and other response, recovery and mitigation plans necessary to cope with this emergency and The Town of Malabar resolution 56-2010 (attached).
