10/17/12 MEETING MINUTES**

This meeting of the Malabar Town Council was held at Town Hall at 2725 Malabar Road.

A. CALL TO ORDER - Meeting was called to order at 7:30 pm by Chair MaryAnn Marsh. The Prayer and Pledge were led by Chair MaryAnn Marsh.

Also the gazebo had been moved from Huggins Park to the Disc Golf Park. The Town of Malabar appreciates the work and time the Board puts in during the year; the Town is giving each member a Monthly Minder calendar as our way of saying thank you.

I. OLD/NEW BUSINESS:

New Business: Save the Recreational Trails Program – Siegmann

Siegmann stated that the Governors can choose to opt out of this program. As you can see, Florida is not among the recipients of this program. The funds available for non-motorized trails are \$75,000; for motorized trails, the funds available are \$800,000. Kelley stated that she would verify with the Town Clerk, but she believed that the Governor did reconsider his position on this and re-instated this program after receiving letters from various agencies. She will verify and report back to the Board at the next scheduled meeting.

Preliminary Draft of Bicycle Path for Malabar – Siegmann

Siegmann stated that he has been all over Florida with the exception of the pan handle. Everyone knows that bikes and cars do not mix. The objectives are to keep the bikes off the high density roads. If possible, we are going to try to have four (4) north/south corridors and four (4) east/west corridors within the Town of Malabar. Most of the roads in Malabar have the bike trails built. How do we know they are compatible; they are low density traffic areas. Riding a bike along Malabar road is very dangerous; he does it several times a week. With Malabar Road being so dangerous, there are two (2) quick fixes; one being from Marie Street to the old daycare center. If the path is put in, the right-of-ways are there. It would need to have millings added and packed down and it would be done. It is doable and very fast to do. Another route would be from Glatter Road down to Railroad Avenue to Town Hall. The right-of-ways are already there. These are just preliminary thoughts; nothing is in stone. Knudson stated these ideas are very good. The situation at the end of Hall at the west end where the barricades are is people were afraid of thieving at the apartments in Palm Bay at that end of town.

Along Malabar Road, he would like to see a barrier along the road when it is four-laned. US 1 is also a state road and it could have bike paths as well. This is just a rough overview so the Board can have some input; he is open to suggestions. There really isn't much left to do in Malabar. The high density areas that can be taken care of right now is Marie Street to the old daycare center. You would go all the way down Glatter Road to Railroad Avenue and keep the people away from the traffic. There is also enough room on the west side of US 1 to build a bike path from border to border. Corey Road is good all the way down. He hadn't looked at the path at the Al Tuttle Trail.

Siegmann attended a meeting in Deltona called Why Trails; Why Now? This was a very good meeting. This trail is very nice and what they are talking about is the St. John's to the Sea Loop. It started off with the Shingle Creek Regional Trail; they are doing it in chunks. There is also the East Central Florida Regional Rail Trail Kennedy Space Center Loop Trail. This is very serious; this trail goes down A1A through the Space Center and out to US 1. There is also the proposed Heart of Florida Greenway Loop; this goes all the way down to St. Petersburg from one coast to the other. Part of this trail is the Al Tuttle Trail.

Old Business: BPTAC Meeting – Pineda Causeway Pilot Program – Siegmann

Siegmann stated that he is the Town's representative and the Town Administrator is the alternate. There are three (3) pilot programs; one being the Pineda Causeway. They have placed barriers along the path to keep the bikes out of the way of the motorized traffic.

Knudson asked who has the final say in the where the bike paths go. Siegmann stated he wasn't sure but they want input from the people. Thomas stated it would be good to all get together for a meeting and get this done.

At this time, the November meeting date was brought up. After discussion with the Board, it was decided to cancel the November meeting as it would be the night before

Thanksgiving holiday. The December meeting is still on the calendar as it is one week before the Christmas holiday.

Recommendations to Council from 9/19/12 Park Board Meeting

Kelley gave information to Board that the gazebo had been moved from Huggins Park to the Disc Golf Park. Knudson stated it looked really nice and the people are enjoying the shade it provides. Kelley reported that Council approved the donation of the batting cage; it will be installed at no cost to the Town. The signage for the Damon-Arnold Lake at the Malabar Community Park is being looked at with the Town Administrator contacting our insurance people with the Florida League of Cities. Council's opinion on this is to do nothing at this time.

J. BOARD MEMBER/STAFF REPORTS:

• **Cameron Preserve – Thomas**

Thomas reported that the picnic table is still over-grown. She used to see the bicyclists stop and have a cold drink. Now no one is using this area of the park due to the over-growth. There are still motorized vehicles in the preserve. There is also a netting mesh that the City of Palm Bay put in to keep the grass in place. It is like big webbing and animals are getting caught in it. Thomas and her husband have helped trapped animals get free from the netting. She felt the whole mesh netting should be taken out and something that would dissolve with time be used.

• **Disc Golf Park – Knudson**

Knudson reported that everything is good at the park. Marsh stated that it's the most popular park we have. Knudson stated it was a brilliant idea to move the gazebo over to this park.

• **Fern Creek Crossing Park – Siegmann**

Siegmann reported that it's there; very wet and looking scruffy. Marsh stated that nothing can be done in the park until it dries out.

• **Huggins Park – Marsh**

Marsh reported that it is the same.

• **Malabar Community Park – Korn & Thomas**

Thomas reported that it looks good; however, she ran into a friend. Thomas asked for input; the person stated that the people cutting the grass and doing the weed-eating are going to close to the trees and stripping the bark off of them. They need to be a little more careful when cutting and weed-eating.

Korn was excused.

Knudson brought up that she has lost several pine trees to boring beetles. It only takes a month and the tree is barren and then they fall over. She advised that the Town may want to take some action before we lose the pine trees in the Disc Golf Park. The way you tell if you have the boring beetles is that the pine needles will turn orange; look on

the ground and you will see saw dust. She stated that the Extension Agency has been notified about this.

- **Trailhead – Siegmann**

Siegmann reported that it is still in good shape.



At the regular Council meeting of November 19, 2012, Council voted to not place any signs at the Damon-Arnold lake in Malabar Community Park prohibiting swimming. They had learned that there was one "no swimming" sign already at the lake and they directed that it should be removed.

These decisions were based on the recommendation of the Town Attorney.

I have attached the agenda report the Town Administrator provided Council as well as the DRAFT minutes on that portion of the meeting.

4. Approve Signage for Damon-Arnold Lake at Malabar Community Park

Recommendation: Request Action

Discussion: TA said she was dealing with this via email with Atty Bohne and has since met with FLC Risk Management representative and he went out to the park and said his recommendation is that they post a no swimming sign and it agrees with what Atty Bohne had said. There is already one no swimming sign there and he said they should post three more so it is viewable from all sides. He did not think we needed to put the informational sign about the ameba but it is not necessary. Four is being recommended. There was already a no swimming sign up there.

Bohne said leave it at no swimming – he agrees with risk manager. By order of Council. McKnight said he prefers no signage. TA said risk manager relayed story where the ability to sue was taken away because of signage. It was a lake in Oakland Park where she used to work. In one area a problem at night. Put up a no swimming sign. The sign stayed up. Two young kids playing ball and the ball went in and a kid went in and kid drowned. There was the posted sign and that is why they couldn't sue.

McKnight said at last meeting attorney said no signs. He did not disagree with FLC risk manager. Bohne said he thought they could get away with no signs. Acquaviva said what about enforcement. TA said the BCSO would enforce. Abare said put up Swim at your own risk. No. Abare said FLC says put up signs and they are the insurance carrier. Beatty said the no diving or no jumping signs can then come down. TA discussed this with risk manager and with the bridge you have a Public invite to jump that is why you have a liability and you need the signs. McKnight said don't post anything you are not going to enforce. Abare said there is a liability issue but he would agree none or four.

MOTION: McKnight / Acquaviva to remove sign that is there that says no swimming and put up no other signs.






Paddock Gate Typical

The eight paddock gates originally had the hinges near the top and bottom of the gates, and at some point, someone moved the hinges more toward the center (vertically) of the gate.

Paddock Latch Typical




Each gate had one hinge up and one hinge down, and the one pointing down was not providing any support. Also, when the hinges were moved before, the bolts that went through them were removed and the top and bottom corners of the gates were coming apart because they had only small nails holding them together.



We used a car jack to lift each gate, removed the upside down hinge and drilled new holes for the hinge on the gate side after adjusting the gate height. We tightened all the existing bolts and bought new ones for the corners where the hinges used to be and installed them.

Also, we added stops so that the gates hit the stop before pressure is put on the hinges.

All eight paddock gates are now operational. Before we started, only one would close all the way!
